

VILLAGE OF BONDUEL
PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING
MONDAY, AUGUST 26, 2019

Chairperson Zuleger called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

Zuleger read a statement regarding the posting of the meeting.

Present: Brenda Staszak and Kay Zuleger. Also, present: Michelle Maroszek, Clerk; Rodney Hoppe, EMS; Paul Hahn, Building Inspector. Absent: Tim Kelley, Antonio Escalante, and Robbie Woldt

AGENDA: Motion by Staszak, second by Zuleger, to approve agenda as presented and deviate from the order as necessary. Motion carried unanimously.

MINUTES. Motion by Zuleger, second by Staszak, to approve minutes from the July 22, 2019 Public Safety Committee meeting with noted change. Motion carried Unanimously.

No Fire Chief or Police Chief Report

G1. First Responder expanded coverage area. Hoppe explained the Cecil-Washington municipalities have asked the Bonduel EMS to cover their municipalities. Workers Compensation for the EMS is part of the Village's insurance policy. Hoppe is working with the clerk and the insurance to determine Cecil-Washington's portion of the insurance. The municipalities would reimburse the Village for the increased insurance coverage. The township of Angelica is also looking for help from Bonduel, Hoppe will be meeting with them on September 9th. More information will be presented to the Public Safety Committee once all details and requests are worked through. By consensus the committee moved to the next meeting.

H4. Garden Shed Policy. Hahn has been requiring residents to anchor garden sheds and yard shed as a safety measure. Hahn stated that houses are required to have anchors, but garden/yard sheds are not required too. The committee received a letter from a resident expressing his concern on having to anchor his shed. Zuleger expressed that she has not found any other municipalities that require anchoring, except for Florida due to hurricanes. The committee agreed by consensus to remove the agenda item and not to implement any new policies in regards to anchoring garden/yard sheds.

H5. Ordinance 103-13 Fences and Walls. Hahn had requested this item be put on the agenda to review the Village's code on side yard setbacks in regards to fences and walls. Hahn has reviewed current ordinance and definitions within the Village code. After reviewing the code, Hahn felt that the side yard setbacks for fences and walls was defined adequately. By consensus the committee agree to remove item from the agenda.

G2. Fire Department capital equipment 2019 budget. Maroszek explained that the Fire Department has not spent all the 2019 money budgeted for the FEMA Grant and compressor. The RIT pack that the Fire Department currently has, does not work with the new equipment. Woldt would like to have the public safety's approval to use the remaining money from the budget to purchase a new RIT pack, chargers and batteries. Motion by Zuleger, second by Staszak, to recommend to the Fire Commission to approve the purchase of the new RIT pack with remainder of the 2019 budgeted money. Motion carried unanimously.

G3. 2020 Capital Equipment requests. Maroszek explained capital equipment requests and the requests from the Fire Department and Police Department. Motion by Staszak, second by Zuleger, to recommend the Fire Department requests as presented and to recommend the Police Department request noting that the price of the squad may change depending on what vehicle is decided upon. Motion carried unanimously.

G4. 2020 Public Safety Budget. Maroszek explained the 2020 budget handouts and what will be required of the committee for the budget. By consensus the committee moved item to the next meeting.

H1. Ordinance Sec. 22.2 possession and use of firearms and other dangerous weapons and Sec. 22.3 throwing or shooting of arrows, stones and other missiles. Maroszek has contacted all land owners in the Village who expressed concern about hunting on private parcels. The proposed overlay map was reviewed along with the revised ordinance. Motion by Zuleger, second by Staszak, to recommend to the board to amend Ordinance Sec. 22-2 including the overlay hunting map and to repeal and recreate Ordinance Sec. 22.3 to include language for Act 71 related to bow hunting. Motion carried unanimously.

H2. Purchase of 2019 Police Squad. By consensus the committee moved to the next meeting since Chief Escalante was not present to discuss.

H3. Hiring full-time police officer. By consensus the committee moved to the next meeting since Chief Escalante was not present to discuss.

H6. Ordinance Sec. 24.6 junk, certain vehicles, recreational equipment and firewood. Committee reviewed the revised ordinance with noted changes from last meeting. Motion by Zuleger, second by Staszak, to recommend to the board to repeal and recreate Ordinance Sec. 24.6 to include updated language on recreational vehicles. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Staszak, second by Zuleger, to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 2:11 p.m.
