

VILLAGE OF BONDUEL  
PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL MEETING  
ATV/UTV ROUTES IN VILLAGE LIMITS  
MONDAY, JANUARY 20, 2020

Chairperson Zuleger opened the Public Informational Meeting regarding the ATV/UTV routes within the Village limits at 3:30 p.m.

Present: Brenda Staszak, Kay Zuleger, Tim Kelley, Police Chief Eric Krause, and Clerk Michelle Maroszek. Village residents present: Gary "Butch" Wudtke, Dennis Bergsbaken, Kaleb Wnuk and Jordan Greuel.

Zuleger took comments from the audience. Wudtke would like see the whole Village opened for ATV/UTV use. Gruel shared that opening the Village would allow Bonduel to be a starting point or drop off point for people heading to other area routes. Bergsbaken and Wnuk were also in favor of opening the Village to ATV/UTV. Zuleger asked residents if they have heard from any residents opposed to opening the routes. Zuleger stated that most of Shawano County is now open for routes. Currently, County Road BE through the Village would be closed to ATV/UTV's since it is a county road. Maroszek shared that Kara Skarlupka is working with the surrounding townships to petition the County and State to open the entire stretch of County Road BE from River Road to Hwy. 22. This is something that will take more time to get approved.

Zuleger closed the informational meeting at 3:44 p.m.

Chairperson Zuleger called the meeting to order at 3:44 p.m.

Zuleger read a statement regarding the posting of the meeting.

Present: Brenda Staszak, Kay Zuleger and Tim Kelley. Police Chief Eric Krause, and Clerk Michelle Maroszek. Village Residents: Gary Wudtke, Dennis Bergsbaken, Kaleb Wnuk, and Jordan Greuel.

AGENDA: Motion by Kelley, second by Staszak, to approve agenda as presented and to deviate from the order as necessary. Motion carried unanimously.

MINUTES. Motion by Staszak, second by Kelley, to approve minutes from the December 9, 2019 Public Safety Committee meeting as presented. Motion carried Unanimously.

G1. Usage of ATV/UTV Routes within the Village. Motion by Kelley, second by Staszak, to recommend to the Board to approve opening ATV/UTV routes within the entire Village and to work with Kara Skarlupka on getting County Road BE open with the adjacent municipalities and obtaining signage. Motion carried unanimously.

H1. Ordinance Sec. 28.15 All-terrain Vehicle Route. Committee reviewed the ordinance changes discussed at the November meeting. Motion by Zuleger, second by Staszak, to recommend to the Board to repeal and recreate Ordinance Sec. 28.15 All-terrain Vehicle Routes and to have the Village Attorney review the ordinance with the updated changes. Motion carried unanimously.

Police Chief Report: Chief Krause has received the approval of the parade route approved by state and county for 2020. The new Evidence program is all in place and just needs to be linked to the server. Equipment has been arriving for the new squad. Rebecca Praegitzer has completed her FTO training.

G2. Public Safety Building Video Camera. The camera company that the Village has used in the past has not got back to Krause. Krause contacted Martin Security Systems, who came out to look at the needs and has put together quotes. The camera system on outside of building would be upgrades, two additional cameras would be added inside the Fire Department and a cable would be installed to the television that would allow the Police Department to monitor activity. The quote is broken into three parts, 1.) The new camera system and computer system, utilizing existing wiring, \$4,934.40; 2.) The two additional cameras in the Fire Station, \$1,470.00; and 3.) Connecting the television to the camera system, \$1,381. The grand total would be \$7,786.19. Motion by Staszak, second by Kelley, to recommend Board to purchase, from Martin Security Systems, the new camera system for the public safety building, the additional cameras for the fire station and to connect the television in the Police Department to the camera system, for a total of \$7,786.19. Motion carried unanimously.

G3. Municipal Court. Chief Krause explained the current fees involved with each citation issued. Krause has contacted the Municipal Court trying to negotiate the current fees being charged. The Village is locked in at the fees until the next election. Krause is recommending that the Public Safety Committee set up a meeting with Municipal Court to see about possibly reducing the current fees. A meeting should be set up with the City Administrator, Judge, Court Clerk, and the Village Municipal Court Attorney, to renegotiate the terms of the contract. Motion by Zuleger, second by Staszak, to set up a meeting to re-negotiate terms of the current Municipal Court contract at the April meeting if possible. Motion carried unanimously.

G4. Building Inspector Commercial inspections. Building Inspector, Paul Hahn, has asked about his commercial building inspector license. He has considered not renewing the commercial portion of his license. Hahn would like to know if the Village would like him to renew his commercial license. Motion by Kelley, second Zuleger, to inform Paul Hahn, that the Village would like him to renew his commercial inspectors license. Motion carried unanimously.

G5. Amending 2020 Budget to reallocate funds. Maroszek explained the need to reallocate funds from the Police Department wages and benefits to the Clerks wages and benefits. In making this allocation, the 2020 Budget would need to be amended by the Board. Motion by Zuleger, second by Kelley, to recommend to the Board to amend the 2020 Budget moving \$8,889.00 from the Police Department wage and benefit accounts to the Clerk wage and benefits accounts. Motion carried unanimously.

G6. Closed Session. Motion by Staszak, second by Zuleger, to move to closed session for approximately five minutes to discuss Police Chief and Officer Compensation and officer hiring process. Inviting Chief Krause and Clerk Maroszek to attend. [Pursuant to Wis. State Statutes, Chapter 19, General Duties of Public Officials, subchapter V, 19.85 exemptions (1)(c) Considering employment, promotion, compensation or performance evaluation data of any public employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction or exercises responsibility.] Roll call vote was taken. Motion carried unanimously. Committee moved to closed session at 4:33 p.m.

*Motion by Staszak, second by Kelley, to recommend to the Board that part-time Officer Rebecca Praegitzer, having finished her officer training, receive an increase in pay from \$15.81 per hour to \$18.00 per hour.*

*Motion by Staszak, second by Kelley, to recommend to the Board that the part-time Police Chief, Eric Krause, agreeing to stay on as the permanently part-time Police Chief, receive an increase in pay from \$33.00 per hour to \$35.00 per hour. Motion carried unanimously.*

Motion by Staszak, second by Kelley, to return to open session. Roll call vote was taken. Motion carried unanimously. Committee returned to open session at 5:14 p.m.

Next meeting: Monday, February 17 at 3:30 p.m.

Motion by Staszak, second by Kelley, to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 5:15 p.m.
