Chairperson Zuleger called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Zuleger read a statement regarding the posting of the meeting.

Present: Kay Zuleger, Tim Kelley and Brenda Staszak. Also, present, Eric Krause, Police Chief.

AGENDA: Motion by Kelley, second Staszak, to approve agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

MINUTES: Minutes weren't provided. January 3rd minutes will need to be approved at next Public Safety meeting.

Police Chief Report. Police Chief report was provided in the packet.

NEW BUSINESS

G1: Discussion and possible recommendation on police radar board.

The police department is receiving a \$7,000 grant and would like to use a portion of that to purchase a police radar board. The radar board can be attached to speed limit signs and can be solar powered and also track the dates and times of speeds. Chief Krause will get quotes for the next Village Board meeting. Motion by Kelley, second by Zuleger, to have Chief Krause get quotes for the next Village Board meeting for approval. Motion carried.

G4: Discussion and possible recommendation on False Alarm Ordinance

A business in town has had 17 false security alarms since January 1st of this year. Shawano County officers have requested that the village cite false security alarms, however the Village currently doesn't have an ordinance regarding false alarms. Committee member Tim Kelley will research other communities false alarm ordinances. This item is to be moved to the next meeting for review of those ordinances.

G5: Discussion and possible action on Lexipol work group

Chief Krause discussed with the committee about the possibility of putting together a work group to update the policies with Lexipol. The committee decided it would be best if just Chief Krause worked with Lexipol.

G6: Discussion and possible recommendation on update to operator/bartender license application

Committee reviewed the changes made to the operator's license by Clerk Michelle Maroszek and Chief Krause. Motion by Kelley, second by Staszak to recommend the changes to the Village Board. Motion carried.

H1: Discussion and possible recommendation on Municipal Court fee negotiation

The Village has negotiated a new fee for citations with Municipal Court of \$5.00. Motion by Staszak, second by Kelley, to have the Village Board review and possibly approve the new contract with Municipal Court when it is finalized. Motion carried.

G7: Closed Session. Move to closed session to discuss personnel. [Pursuant to Wis. State Statutes, Chapter 19, General Duties of Public Officials, subchapter V, 19.85 exemptions (1)(c) [Considering employment, promotion, compensation, or performance evaluation data of any public employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction or exercises responsibility.] At the end of the closed session, the Commission will reconvene in open session

Motion by Kelley, second by Zuleger, to move into closed session at 6:37 p.m. for approximately 5 minutes inviting Chief Krause. Kay Zuleger will take over recording the minutes.

Motion by Kelley, second by Staszak to move out of closed session at 6:55 p.m. Motion carried.
