THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF BONDUEL, SHAWANO COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN that the Municipal Code of Bonduel, Wisconsin, Chapter 28, TRAFFIC CODE, Section 28-12 Skateboards and Roller Skates and Section 28-13 Inline Skates Regulated is hereby repealed and removed:

Sec. 28-12. - Skateboards and roller skates.

- (a) *Regulated.* It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or ride a skateboard or roller skates in any of the following places:
- (1) Any village street.
 - (2) Any sidewalk in a business district or in any area designated as a heavy traffic route.
 - (3) Any public parking lot.
 - (4) Private property unless permission has been received from the owner, lessee or person in charge of the property.
- (b) *Right-of-way.* Operators or riders of skateboards or roller-skates shall yield the right-of-way to other pedestrians using village sidewalks, and shall not otherwise endanger or interfere with normal pedestrian traffic on those sidewalks.

Sec. 28-13. - Inline skates regulated.

- (a) *State laws applicable.* Every person using inline skates upon a public roadway shall be subject to the provisions of all ordinances and state laws applicable to the operator of any vehicle, except those provisions with reference to equipment of vehicle and except those provisions which, by their nature, would have no application.
- (b) *Public sidewalks or walkways.* Every person using inline skates upon a sidewalk or walkway shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall exercise due care when passing any other person.
- (c) *Public parking lots and private property.* It shall be unlawful for any person to use inline skates in any public parking lot. It shall be further unlawful for any person to use inline skates on private property unless permission has been received from the owner, lessee or person in charge of the property.

(d) *Riding on roadway.*

- (1) Every person using inline skates on any public street or alley shall keep as close to the right-hand curb as possible and shall proceed with traffic. Every person using inline skates upon a one-way public street or alley shall proceed in the direction of the one-way traffic.
- (2) Every person using inline skates upon a roadway shall ride single file.
- (3) No person using inline skates shall ride on the following streets:
 - a. On Green Bay Street, from First Street to Church Street.
 - b. On Cecil Street, from Mill Street to State Street.
- (4) Persons using inline skates upon a public roadway shall not impede the normal and reasonable movement of motor vehicle traffic.

(e) *Inline skating prohibited after daylight hours.* It shall be unlawful to use inline skates on any village roadway or sidewalk after daylight hours.

(f) *Clinging to moving vehicles prohibited.* It shall be unlawful for any person using inline skates to cling to or attach to any bicycle or other moving vehicle upon a public roadway.

(g) *Playing games in roadway prohibited.* It shall be unlawful to play hockey or any other game on inline skates on any village roadway.

(h) *Observance of traffic regulations.* Every person using inline skates upon a public roadway shall stop for all stop signs and traffic signals.

(i) *Yielding to traffic.* The operator of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to a user of inline skates in the same manner as for bicyclists and pedestrians under Wis. Stats. §§ 346.23, 346.24, 346.36 and 346.38. When using inline skates, every person shall, upon entering a public roadway, yield the right-of-way to motor vehicles, except that a person using inline skates shall be subject to the same regulations as bicyclists and pedestrians under Wis. Stats. §§ 346.23, 346.24, 346.37 and 346.38.

This ordinance repeal and removal shall take effect upon passage and publication and/or posting as provided by law.
