**THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF BONDUEL, SHAWANO COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN that the Municipal Code of Bonduel, Wisconsin, Chapter 24 PUBLIC NUISANCES, Section 24-6(f) Junk, certain vehicles, recreational equipment and firewood, is hereby repealed and recreated as follows:**

Sec. 24-6. - Junk, certain vehicles, recreational equipment and firewood.

- (f) *Permitted parking or storage of recreational vehicles.* In all residential and commercial districts provided for in this chapter, it is permissible to park or store a recreational vehicle, boat or trailer on private property as set forth in this section.
- (1) Recreational vehicle defined. For the purposes of this subsection, the term "recreational vehicle" shall be defined as the following:
- a. *Class A motor home.* A motor vehicle exceeding 21 feet in length, designed to be operated upon a highway, for use as a mobile dwelling, equipped with sleeping, cooking, eating and bathroom facilities.
  - b. *Class B motor home.* A van-type vehicle, exceeding 21 feet in length, designed to be operated upon a highway, for use as a mobile dwelling, equipped with sleeping, cooking, eating and bathroom facilities.
  - c. *Class C motor home.* A van-type motor vehicle, with an attached cab section, designed to be operated upon a highway, for use as a mobile dwelling, equipped with sleeping, cooking, eating and bathroom facilities.
  - d. *Fifth-wheel trailer.* A mobile home, designed to be used as a mobile dwelling, equipped with sleeping, cooking, eating and bathroom facilities, designed to be towed by a motor vehicle with a flatbed frame.
  - e. *Travel trailer.* A temporary mobile dwelling unit, designed to be towed by a car, van or pickup by means of a bumper or frame hitch.
  - f. *Folding tent camper.* A lightweight unit with sides that collapse for towing and storage that is designed to be towed by a car, van or pickup by means of a bumper or frame hitch.
  - g. *Truck camper.* A temporary dwelling unit loaded, placed or attached upon the bed or chassis of a pickup truck or similar motor vehicle.
  - h. *Small boat.* A boat of less than 18 feet in length, including, but not limited to, canoes, kayaks, jet skis and other personal watercraft.
  - i. *Large boat.* Any watercraft that exceeds 18 feet in length.
  - j. *Utility trailer.* A trailer with a bottom less than eight feet by five feet in size.
  - k. *Large trailer.* Any trailer, the bottom of which exceeds eight feet by five feet in size.

- (2) Parking is permitted inside any enclosed structure; which structure otherwise conforms to the zoning requirements of the particular zoning district where located.
- (3) Parking is permitted outside in the side yard or rear yard, during the time period of April 1<sup>st</sup> to October 31<sup>st</sup>, provided it is not nearer than five feet to the lot line.
- (4) Parking is permitted outside on a hard-surfaced or well-drained gravel driveway provided:
  - a. Space is not available in the rear yard or side yard or there is no reasonable access to either the side yard or rear yard. A corner lot is always deemed to have reasonable access to the rear yard. A fence is not necessarily deemed to prevent reasonable access.
  - b. Inside parking is not possible.
  - c. The unit is parked perpendicular to the front curb.
- (5) The body of the recreational vehicle, boat or trailer must be at least 15 feet from the face of any curb.
- (6) No part of the unit may extend over the public sidewalks or public right-of-way
- (7) Parking is permitted only for storage purposes. Recreational vehicles, boats or trailers shall not be:
  - a. Used for dwelling purposes, except for overnight sleeping for a maximum of 14 days in any calendar year. Cooking is not permitted at any time.
  - b. Permanently connected to sewer lines, waterlines or electricity. The recreational vehicle may be connected to electricity temporarily for charging batteries and other purposes.
  - c. Used for storage of goods, materials or equipment other than those items consideration to be part of the unit or essential for its immediate use.
- (8) Notwithstanding the above, a unit may be parked anywhere on the premises during active loading or unloading for no more than 48 hours, and the use of electricity or propane fuel is permitted when necessary to prepare a recreational vehicle for use
- (9) The recreational vehicle, boat or trailers shall be owned by the resident on whose property the unit is parked for storage.
- (10) *Exceptions.* The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to parcels from which recreational equipment or recreational vehicles are displayed for sale and sold by a commercial enterprise regularly engaged in the sale of such equipment or vehicles.

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication and/or posting as provided by law.
